Holes are an almost endless subject because there are so many of them. The whole world is full of holes! Everything is mostly holes with just a little bit of something around them.

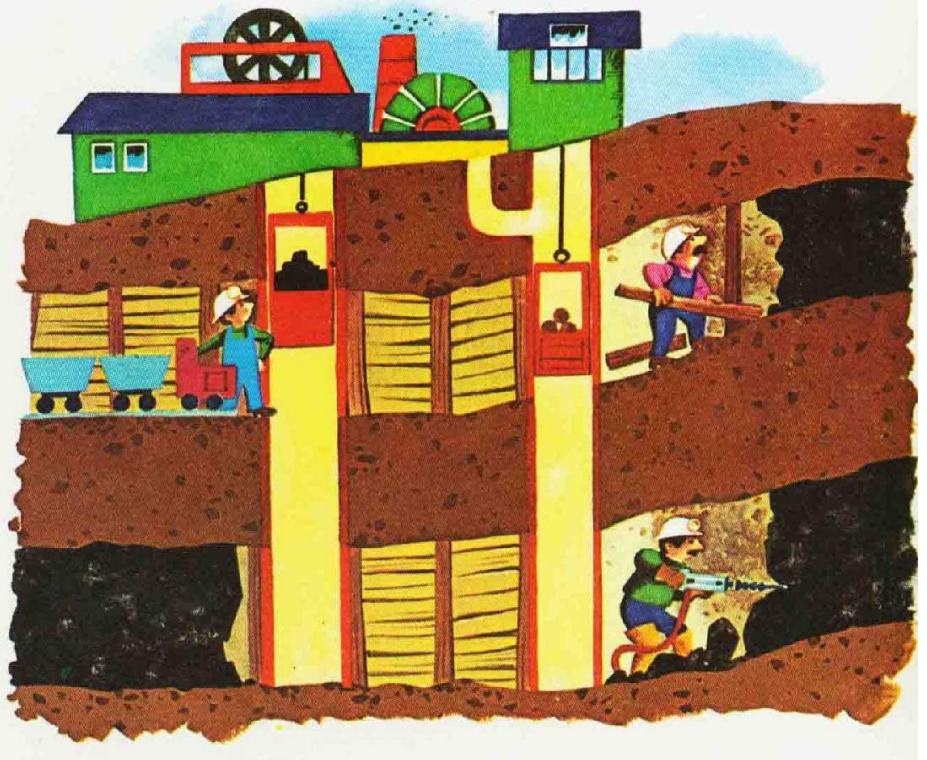


The earth itself is a hollow sphere full of fire, and every now and then the fire comes out through holes called volcanoes.
